PE



We have timetabled PE daily; whether it be fitness activities or PE lessons. For this reason, we ask that your child(ren) brings appropriate footwear daily. For those children who cannot participate in PE for prolonged periods, we ask that a note to the teacher is provided (email is fine).

Snack Break and Water

Water and food fuels the brain! The children are welcome to have a water bottle in class and will be encouraged to have a healthy snack break during the first session of the day. The children may fill up their drink bottles from the taps in the classroom.

Cellphones

We understand that many children need their cellphone at school for personal arrangements and safety reasons before and after school and encourage them to bring their cellphone to school for this purpose. Once the children are at school the cellphones are handed in and are taken to the school

office. At the end of the day, we collect them and hand them back to the children. If you need to get a message to your children during the day, we ask that this is directed via the school office so that we can ensure the message gets through to the children.
